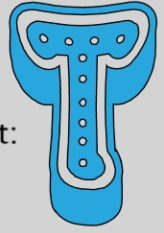


TIPS:

- Create a Font Group: Layered Fonts or 3D Fonts
- Move fonts into this new group that have separate pieces.
- When typing your title: ALL CAPS may work better. Note: in some fonts the letters run together and this doesn't work as well.
- Remember: You cannot edit the shape of a text shape - you must use the outliner.

Starfish

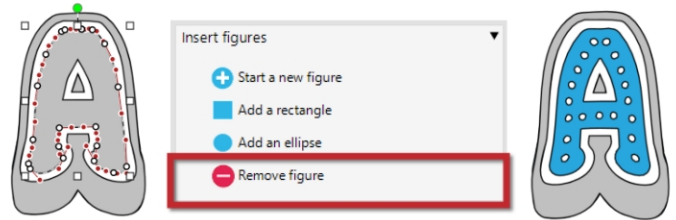


TEXT SHAPE & OUTLINER

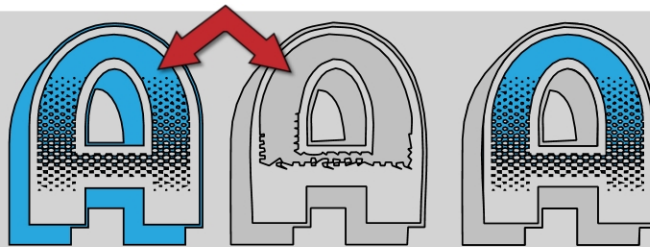
- 1 Add text shape to a page: Insert Ribbon: Text Section: Shape
- 2 Type in title. (all CAPS may work better) Select font: select a font that has pieces that don't touch in each letter. See sample above right: there is an inner and outer piece that are not connected..
- 3 Resize on page as desired. Leave fill as default for now. Set stroke to **0.50**. Create.
- 4 Add outliner shape: Insert Ribbon: Other Section: Outliner. Set stroke to **0.5**

SHAPE EDITING

- 5 Edit outliner shape to remove one part of each letter. Right click on outliner shape: **Shape: Edit Shape**. Click on piece of the letter that you want to remove. Click on **"Remove Figure"** in operations panel on the right of your workspace. Note: sometimes the outliner reads your shape incorrectly and the lines are "wonky." You may need to correct them before separating the parts of the letter (see video for more information). **TIP: I found it helpful to zoom way in during shape editing.**



TIP: When choosing which part of the letter to remove from outliner, I choose the area that has more detail. It shows up better in the text shape.



Example (left): Font: Bugbear Detail in the center piece shows much better on the text shape rather than the outliner. So, when editing the shape of the outliner, remove that piece.

FILL & FINISH

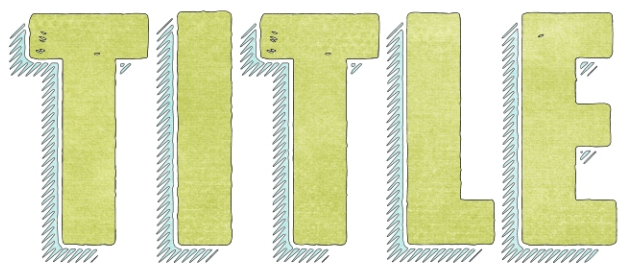
- 6 Select text shape. Select desired fill:
OAT: Fill: Drop down menu.
Select outliner shape: Select desired fill:
OAT: Fill: Drop down menu
- 7 Add finishing touches: stroke settings, shadows, filters, & effects.



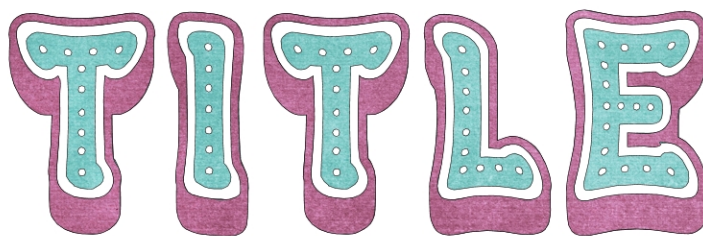

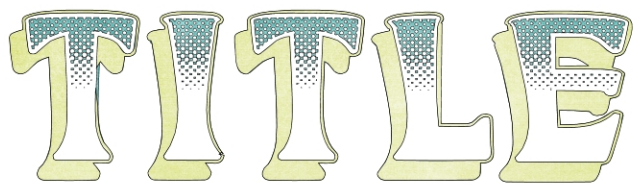

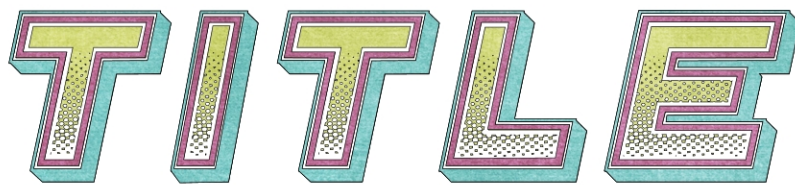

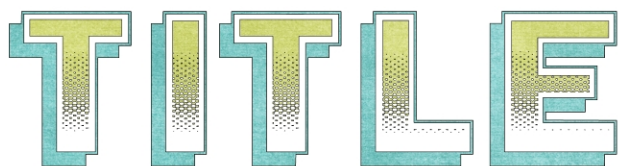

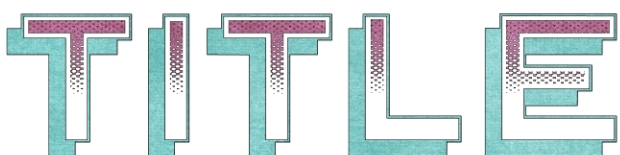

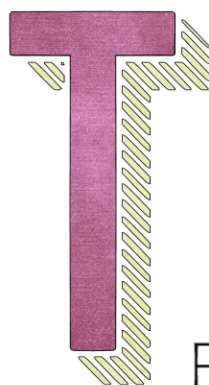

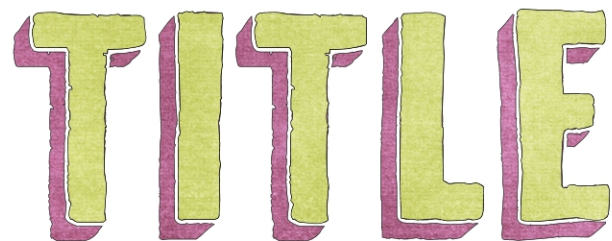
